Pualani Muraki is a coffee farmer in the hills above the Kona Coast on the Big Island of Hawai'i. She is also an active member of the Lanakila Congregational Church in Kealakakua, a member of the Hawai'i Conference of the United Church of Christ. In 1999, she was a delegate from the conference to General Synod in Providence. That was the year that the Massachusetts Conference brought forth a resolution to declare the United Church of Christ a fair trade coffee church. Pualani sat in on the committee that discussed the resolution. She approached Wally Ryan Kuroiwa of the Justice and Witness Ministries staff saying Kona coffee farmers needed to be involved. As a result, the Small Farmers Fund, supported by the sales of fair trade coffee in UCC congregations, has helped a group of those small farmers begin a cooperative with the hope that they can become a part of the movement.

For the months of July and August, in addition to the 9:30 am regular worship service, First Church of Christ, UCC in Sandwich, MA holds a 30-minute service in the patio garden adjacent to the church. Led by lay persons, the service consists of music (guitar, synthesizer and quiet drums), scripture, prayer and a meditation/ conversation time on themes such as hope, God's creation, earthly needs, and forgiveness. Designed for parishioners of all ages, the Summer Garden Service is particularly attractive to young families invited to "come as you are." Neighboring towns Oak Glen & Yucaipa are well known for their apple orchards, cider mills, curio shops and magnificent scenery. Tall stands of pine trees, mountain streams & clean air provide the perfect environment for individuals from all walks of life to gather, celebrate & be at peace. The ropes course is a life-changing experience of team-building and personal growth. Both low and high challenge courses consist of a number of events which form a series of challenges of graduated difficulty. Completing these tasks with your group leads to feelings of self-esteem & respect for self and others.

Jim and Jayanthi Wilson, Global Ministries missionaries in Botswana, have known times when giving up seemed to be the only answer. Jayanthi experienced such a time when finances and leadership were in crisis at Sedibeng – a training center for disadvantaged youth and women where she worked. Then, unexpectedly, a call came from someone opening a restaurant who remembered the good accomplished at Sedibeng. Jayanthi was able to contact some former students who were then hired to work in the restaurant. Their hope was restored and Jayanthi found, once again, that her patience and openness were rewarded.

Outreach for the youth fellowship at Grace United Church of Christ in Lancaster, OH means reaching out to the Fairfield County community and across the globe. Every month, the youth group participates in faith-based community service activities throughout the area. They work with local food pantries, humane societies and all those in need. "If somebody needs some help," said Julie Walter, director of Christian education at Grace United, "We just gather the troops and go." So it was only natural the "troops" gathered in August of 2007 to fight world hunger during a five-day stay at Heifer Project International Ranch in Perryville, Arkansas. Heifer Project International is a nonprofit organization that works to end world hunger and poverty by teaching impoverished communities how to care for the earth and food sources instead of using short-term relief. The group stayed in a makeshift global village that resembled a modern urban slum area. The trip to the ranch was about education.

June 11, 2009

Hanapepe Hawaiian Congregational Church on the island of Kaua'i has always placed a strong value on music and dreamed of forming a children's choir. However, until recently, timing, commitment, and availability of people and resources made it difficult to get such a program going. All that changed last year when a mother in the church became inspired after hearing choirs from a local children's opera theater perform one Sunday morning during worship. She approached church leaders, who supported the idea, and two people were sent to a summer program at Azusa Pacific University, which offered training in the Kodaly Method, widely used to teach music to children. The Kodaly method starts with simple children's songs associated with their country and leads to the recognition of beat, rhythm, and melodic and harmonic intervals. The children's choir officially began in the fall of 2007.
